<p><b>Clinical Training Programme:</b></p> <p>These 12-month programmes are divided into 3 blocks. There are two clinical posts: one based at the Leicester Royal Infirmary with the Diabetes and Endocrinology team which includes acute medicine on-call and another based at a community practice (Dr Ghatora – Shepshed). These are dedicated posts that provide the post-holder with a broad training in acute and chronic medicine. These posts easily allow the individual to acquire all the Foundation competencies within 8 months.</p> <p><b>Academic Activities:</b></p> <p>All academic Foundation doctors will have the opportunity to choose their own 4 month research project and research supervisor.
