Main duties:

There is a high turnover of new admissions. The most common cases are mild to moderate respiratory and gastrointestinal illnesses but there is also a good range of other cases. As an F1, the role is to support the rest of the medical and nursing team in diagnosing and treating illnesses; this starts with a daily consultant-led ward round. The remainder of the day involves completing plans agreed on the ward round including blood tests, investigation requests, specialty referals and patient reviews. During the ward round, there are Case Based Discussions, which allows for bedside clinical teaching. Given the high turnover of patients, the ward can be very busy and so a good proportion of the day is devoted to completed discharge paperwork. There is a handover meeting starting at 9am and the day finishes with a short handover meeting at 5pm.

The clinical supervisor for this post is Dr T Acharya.

Educational Activities:

There is regular and comprehensive Tuesday and Thursday lunchtime teaching led by different grades of trainees or vistors. Friday features the grand round, discussion of all in-patients (Paediatric and Neonates) and any interesting cases from last week. In addition, there is the weekly F1 Academic Programme, patient safety forums and Hospital Academic Half Days. The F1 Trainee is encouraged to take part in an audit during this post.

Other Comments (if appropriate):

The Paediatric (Skylark) Ward based in the new Foundation Wing of Kettering General Hospital includes 4 HDU and 20 general patient beds. The department inclues a level 2 NICU (4 neonatel intensive care cots and 12 high dependency care cots). The role includes an intensive 2 day Directorate Induction including Paediatric and Newborn Life Support and Level 2 Safeguarding Children Training. This is a valuable experience of the safeguarding process highlighting differences between a family in need and child protection concerns. The trainees are able to attend strategy meetings, child protection conferences and multidisciplinary team meetings. The post has 50% banding.
