Other Comments (if appropriate):

General areas

The foundation trainee will learn generic skills in history taking, physical examination, and management of frail older patients with acute medical problems. They will also be involved in organising appropriate investigations, and referring on to other specialists. They will learn how to manage difficult consultations and communication skills, in particular around end of life and uncertain recovery in acute illness. The post requires skills in organisation, prioritisation and time management which will be developed with the support of the clinical supervisor.

Specialist areas

The trainee will be able to develop a specialist approach to the comprehensive assessment of the frail older patient. Skills developed will include communication, holistic management and appropriate prescribing. During their time with the department they will be exposed to various dementia syndromes, parkinsonism, delirium and varied medical problems in older frail patients. The trainees will gain experience in patients with uncertain recovery, end of life and complex feeding decision in dementia. They will work as part of a specialist MDT gaining an insight into how physiotherapists, occupational therapists and social works interact and operates.
