The trainee will be able to satisfy the majority of the components of the Foundation curriculum, with a particular expertise in section 3 (Clinical care) of the Foundation Curriculum. The placement offers direct clinical supervision 24 hours a day with dedicated Consultant time for completion of SLE. The medical team in AED are responsible for the initial assessment and management of patients who either self-present or present by ambulance and their subsequent admission or discharge from hospital. Typically for Emergency Department patients these can present with any initial complaint and severity ensuring a broad clinical exposure to adult Emergency Medicine. There also exists the opportunity to work with colleagues in the Children's Emergency Department if the trainee wishes to gain some experience in this speciality. The clinical supervisor for FY1 trainees is Dr Nick Howarth, Associate Specialist in Emergency Medicine. Example working pattern:- The FY1 training post in AED has 3 shift patterns:- Week 1 – 1030 to 1830 Tuesday to Thursday. Week 2 – 0700 to 1500 Monday to Friday. Week 3 – 0830 to 1630 Monday to Saturday (0900 start on Saturday) – Ward cover.
