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Description of training post	With respect to the Dental Core Training Curriculum the training post will provide opportunities to demonstrate evidence to the required generic and service speciality specific competencies. In Oral Surgery a DCT3 in Oral Surgery will be exposed to a wide range of experiences including consultant clinics, dedicated DCT surgical sessions, primary care assessment & treatment clinics and TMD clinics. DCT's will also have the opportunity to assist senior members of staff performing more advanced surgical procedures. Treatment under local anaesthetic, relative analgesia, intravenous sedation and general anaesthetic are all provided within the Oral Surgery department and DCT's will be involved with treatment associated with all of these modalities. The sedation rotation involves a structured programme of training in administration of IV Sedation to support clinical treatment in Oral Surgery. There will be ample opportunity to become involved in clinical audit and DCT's are expected to attend a monthly departmental meeting encompassing teaching and service development discussions. DCT3s in Oral Medicine participate fully in the work of the department. They attend consultant-led clinics, seeing new and review patients, carry out investigations including mucosal biopsies and blood tests and have an important part to play in checking the results of investigations and taking action on any abnormalities identified. They also participate in departmental meetings, audit projects and prepare presentations for journal club meetings. DCTs are encouraged to attend regional and national oral medicine meetings and to present cases and posters. All DCTs also gain experience in managing patients with complex medical histories.
