Educational Activities:

The programme is delivered by Emergency Department senior staff and comprises of five full days of teaching with recorded mandatory attendance.

Each session is based on a specific Foundation Programme outcome and competence related to an Emergency Medicine placement within Foundation training. Each group teaching session will provide:

- a contextual overview of underpinning knowledge, technical & non-technical (behavioural) skills relevant to the Foundation topic area
- a framework for learning and study
- a reminder of required competences and how they can be achieved and demonstrated
- a forum for discussion of particularly complex/difficult aspects within the topic area.

This is achieved through interactive case based discussions with preparatory work having been completed by the Foundation trainee on the LRI ED section of the LETB Moodle.
