Main duties:

AICU duties include attendance at handover of patient care, ward review with consultants and senior trainees, documentation of any review, maintain accurate drug charts, complete discharge paperwork & handover of patients to ward staff (including ECMO patients), prepare case summaries for M&M meetings, admit patients to AICU, liaise with members of the AICU MDT such as physiotherapists, pharmacists, microbiologist, radiologists etc, learn & perform technical skills such as venous cannulations (peripheral & central), airway control etc Theatre duties include pre-operative assessments, intra-operative care to include airway management, IV cannulation, anaesthesia related pharmacy and post-operative management to include pain management etc.
