## Main duties:

The Emergency Department at Kettering General Hospital sees approximately 250 patients per day, including all: medical cases, trauma, cardiology, surgical and paediatrics. The patients are brought by the ambulancies and also self presenting.

The Department has a 13 bay Major Area, 5 bay Resuscitation Room, 4 bay Paedriatric Area, 7 bay Emergency Decision Unit (EDU).

The Department has an minor injuries area seeing ambulatory walk-in patients with minor injury and illness.

The FY2 doctor attached to the Emergency Department will work as part of a multi-disciplinary team, in initial assessment and management of adults and children presenting with a wide range of medical, surgical, paedriatric and psychiatric conditions.

FY2 doctors work in all areas of the department (resuscitation, majors, minors, paedriatric, EDU) and would be expected to see, assess and treat patients with very close support and supervision from senior colleagues.

The FY2 will learn how to independently manage the Emergency Department patients. This will include orderin and interpreting tests, liason with other specialities to ensure safe patient discharge or appropriate patient admission.

Training in ressuscitation of adults and children is provided and there is opportunity to undertake a wide range of practical skills such as suturing and fracture manipulation under supervision.

This post also provides the chance to develop competencies in the management of the acutely unwell patient.

## **Educational Activities:**

There is a detailed and structured induction process as well as teaching time.

Learning opportunities include:

- wide range of e-learning materials available

F2 teaching takes place most Thursday afternoons and covers a wide range of topics.
