Main duties: This post is based on both the Childrens ward and the Special Care Baby Unit at the Pilgrim Hospital. The job involves taking referrals from					
General Practicioners, the Emergency Department and Midwives. The post holder would undertake supervised admission of acutely ill children including the formation of an initial plan of investigations and management. There are plenty of opportunities to undertake practical procedures such as IV lines and phlebotomy on small infants and children along with opportunities to develop further practical skills such a lumbar puncture. Neonatal examinations including routine newborn examinations as well as acute assessments are also part of the post and provide a good amount of experience in dealing with these very young patients. There are also opportunities to attend both general and specialty paediatric clinics with clinics being conducted both by the 6 local paediatricians and visiting paediatricians from tertiary centres.

Daily handover is consultant supervised and provides and educational opportunity. There is ward based experience on both the paediatric ward and special care baby unit, labour ward and maternity ward. Patients are also sometimes reviewed in the emergency department by the paediatric team. Ward rounds are consultant led and provide an opportunity for bedside teaching. There is weekly paediatric teaching which is delivered by trainees under consultant supervision, weekly journal club, twice monthly neonatal simulation sessions and monthly safeguarding peer review sessions. There is a monthly perinatal morbidity and mortality meeting at which trainees also present.
