9.	Description of training post	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The unit is a tertiary teaching hospital and a regional centre for Cleft and Craniofacial surgery. The department also delivers large volumes of trauma care, head & neck cancer care and oral surgery / oral medicine. • Trainees will access opportunities in all these areas and will also work with colleagues in orthodontics and restorative dentistry as part of MDT clinics. • DCTs will have their own MOS sessions supervised by registrars, staff grades and consultants. They will also have exposure to GA lists where a wide range of training opportunities are delivered.

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All trainees will be supported to deliver Audit and QI projects and are encouraged to produce original research for presentation at national and international meetings. This has always been a strength of the unit. As a tertiary centre, the unit has trainees in OMFS, Oral Surgery, Orthodontics and Restorative dentistry in the hub and spoke units.

12.	Pattern of working including any on-call commitment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Daytime pattern of working varies between Clinics, theatres, ward cover, trauma cover. There are specialist and general clinics at QEHB as well as MOS, sedation and Orthognathic planning clinics. In the spoke units at Solihull, City and Heartlands there are Outpatient clinics, MOS treatments, Sedation lists and Daycase surgery lists. The Heartlands sessions are Paediatric OMFS daycase lists The rota is a full shift pattern. Trainees will cover long days, weekends, nights with a rotating pattern and supervision from second tier OMFS trainees available 24/7. There are ten trainees, which equates to a frequency of one in ten for each aspect of the rota. Days off for rest and prior to oncalls are built in and the rota is compliant with Junior Doctor contract expectations.
13.	Educational programme summary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There is a monthly programme of Regional DCT study days. There is weekly teaching in the unit as well as a monthly education / governance day with DCT teaching. Study leave is available via NHSE and is supported by the trust and department. This is individual, but trainees in the past year have presented internationally and nationally at specialty association meetings.
